Keystone wishes to recognize the support that volunteers and staff provide to their libraries each year. We will do so this year with the Julie Klauber Award.

Who was Julie Klauber?

Julie Klauber was a national expert and leader on disability issues and instrumental in helping develop Keystone's growing national presence. In 2002, Julie received the ASCLA Francis Joseph Campbell Award recognizing her work advancing library services for the blind and physically handicapped.

Julie served as the director of Talking Books Plus library in Suffolk County, NY, and authored several articles on library resources and services for people with disabilities. Additionally, she created and maintained the newsletter, Disability Resources Monthly, and the corresponding website (www.disabilityresources.org). Julie passed away on September 3, 2002 after a long, brave struggle with cancer.

Who can be nominated?

Each library may nominate one volunteer or staff member who works with KLAS, has shown outstanding service during his/her time with the library, and will appreciate and benefit from attending the KLAS Users Conference.

What does the recipient receive?
